ARTSPACE LOVELAND LOFTS CELEBRATES GRAND OPENING FEBRUARY 11

Public celebration scheduled from 4:00 – 7:00 p.m.

Artspace is pleased to announce the Grand Opening celebration for Artspace Loveland Lofts, scheduled for Thursday, February 11, 2016 at 4:00 pm in Loveland, Colorado. The ceremony will take place at the Lofts at 140 W. 3rd Street.

Among those scheduled to appear at the ceremony are Loveland Mayor Cecil Gutierrez; Sam Betters, Executive Director of the Housing Authority of the City of Loveland; Alison George, Director of the Colorado Department of Local Affairs – Division of Housing; Cris White, Executive Director and CEO of the Colorado Housing and Finance Authority; Roger Clark, Vice President of the Erion Foundation Board of Directors; Sandra Gisonti, Resident Artists at Artspace Loveland Lofts; Greg Handberg, Senior VP of Artspace; and Shannon Joern, Senior Director of National Advancement for Artspace.

Brief remarks are scheduled for 4:30, followed by a reception in the Loveland Lofts Gallery and Open Studios from 5:30 to 7:00. Local musician Roger James is scheduled to perform, with catering and beverages provided by Generations Wine & Martini Bar, and Crow Hop Brewery.

"We've come a long way from our groundbreaking just two years ago," said Artspace Senior Vice President Greg Handberg. "We're tremendously grateful to our partners, and excited for the artists in Loveland, and we look forward to celebrating the opening of this beautiful space with them."

Loveland Artspace Arts Campus is a sustainable, mixed-use, community arts campus project in downtown Loveland, consisting of three parts: a new 30-unit affordable live/work facility for low income artists and their families; the historic Loveland Feed & Grain Building, which will be transformed into a home for artist entrepreneurs and creative businesses; and landscaped outdoor community space tying the two buildings together as one arts campus. Artspace continues to advance the second component of the Loveland Artspace Arts Campus, the renovation of the historic Feed & Grain into a creative sector incubator facility, which is expected to begin construction later in 2016.
