Little Rock/North Little Rock (The Rocks) to launch online survey September 24th to determine affordable space needs for area artists/creatives/makers, arts organizations, and creative businesses

Little Rock/North Little Rock (The Rocks) — Artspace today announced that it will conduct a major online survey of artists/creatives/makers, arts organizations, and creative businesses in The Rocks area to determine the size and nature of the market for a potential Artspace affordable mixed-use project in the community. A large response by the creative sector will result in the most usable information and is a critical next step to advancing a project. Completion of the survey can occur anytime between September 24-November 5.

The six-week survey will be launched with a free public event at 5:30 pm on September 24, 2019 at CHARTS at Pulaski Tech, 3000 West Scenic Drive, North Little Rock. The event is open to all; artists, arts organization staff members, and creative business owners are especially encouraged to attend. Entertainment, food, and beverages will be provided; abundant free parking is available. A complimentary shuttle provided by Rock Region METRO will be available to and from the event. Pick-up will be at 5:00 pm at Mosaic Templars Cultural Center, 501 W. 9th Street, Little Rock. Seating is limited; those interested in riding on the shuttle should make sure to place a shuttle reservation by calling 816-309-1939 or emailing kennedym@hendrix.edu.

Artspace, the nation's leading nonprofit developer for the arts, will use the survey to identify the types and number of spaces needed by The Rocks artists, the amenities, and the special features that are of interest to them. The results of the survey will help Artspace determine the size of the market in The Rocks for affordable live/work housing, private studio space, shared creative space, and/or shared performing arts space.

The survey is the second phase of a scope of work that, with the generous support of the Windgate Foundation, began in July, 2019, when an Artspace team conducted a Preliminary Feasibility Study in The Rocks. If the survey identifies a strong market need for an Artspace project and the community decides to proceed, survey results will inform both the project concept and site selection. Results will also impact specific design and programmatic decisions, such as the number and types of affordable artist housing and working spaces, parking options, types of shared creative spaces, amenities to include, affordable rent ranges, etc. Artists who take the survey will have the option of being among the first to be informed of project developments, including leasing opportunities.
